KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- **First Quarter (April 2018 - June 2018)**

In the month of April, one of our students named Sunny along with other students went to a Meet In North Delhi where students from other NGOs also participated. In the Meet, Sunny was given an opportunity to sing. He was also awarded for the same.

A donor invited us to a Jagran function at a park in Safdarjung Enclave, in which all our visually impaired students took participation. They also had dinner with the attendant in the evening.

In April, one of our supporters organized a dinner party for our students and also gave donations in the form of groceries.

In April, Jain Social welfare Association organised a function on the occasion of Mahaveer Jayanti. Honorable MLA Mr. Somnath Bharti came and met our students and Munni Jee gave a motivating speech for living a good life and awareness on diet and spirituality. Students appreciated the session and were able to draw learnings for their lives. We also received groceries and monetary contribution for the support of visually impaired students.

In May, we bought *Recording Devices* for the visually impaired students.

We also received support of students from IIT Delhi who volunteered their services in terms of reading books and recording study material for our visually impaired students. They also performed administrative work. Volunteers helped our students in preparing their assignments and extended their support in facilitating English conversation classes.

Later in the month of June, some visitors came to celebrate their birthdays with our students and also sponsored food for them.

In June, we shifted our Head Office from the existing address to a new address in East Of Kailash. Here, our organization collaborated with 'Youth 4 Jobs Foundation' and we provided food and Hostel facilities to the visually impaired students training with the above mentioned organisation.



- **Second Quarter (July 2018 - September 2018)**

In the month of July, we bought computer systems equipped with *Screen Reading Software* for the students and administrative work.

We organized a dinner in the month of August for our students.

We also received support of some volunteers who visited our organization on weekends. These volunteers helped our students to strengthen their English speaking skills by communicating with them.

In August, we bought Trunks for the students with the help of our donors.

In September, we provided Bedsheets and Pillow covers to the students.

Various supporters of our organization visited us and provided services to the students which helped them in their overall Personality Development. These included meditation and other activities spreading positivity in the lives of our students. These activities helped our students in enhancing their focus and concentration levels.



• **Third Quarter (October 2018 – December 2018)**

In the Month of October we were invited along with our students in a program organized by ‘Hindustan Prefab Limited’.

The program was remarked by the presence of various guests and chief guests including Honorable Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri from Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation.

Our visually impaired students namely Suraj and Kapil participated in activities such as singing and poetry recitation. Many other children took participation in activities such as drawing and planting of trees. The Honorable Chief Guests really appreciated the performances of the students. The theme of the program was based on “ SWACHTA HI SEVA ABHIYAN” . In the program, school bags were given to all the students and later Lunch was also organized for them.

Shoes were provided in November. A dinner was organized for our students on the occasion of Christmas in December and blankets were also given to them which they greatly appreciated.



- **Fourth Quarter (January 2019 – March 2019)**

On the occasion of New Year, we distributed Sweaters among our students.

We also provided our students with Jackets on the occasion of Lohri. This effort from our side really brought smiles on the faces of our students. In January, we bought more *Recording Devices* for our students.

In February, we bought Books for our students. Books were in the form of study materials and books relating to extra co-curricular activities.

We organized a drawing competition at Vasant Vihar (Bhawar Singh Camp) in February for our students. Prizes were also distributed to the winners of the drawing competition.

In March, we purchased furniture for our students as well as our office work.

In March, we also purchased various appliances such as wall fans for the convenience of our students.
