



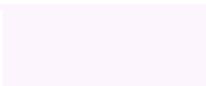

Key Highlights

Quarter 1 (April 2022 – June 2022)

The Jain Social Welfare Association organized a function on the occasion of Mahaveer Jayanti. Honorable MLA Mr. Somnath Bharti came and met our student's and Munni Jee gave a motivating speech for living a good life and spread awareness on topics diet and spirituality.

Students appreciated the session and were able to draw learnings for their lives. We received desktop for the support of visually impaired and physically challenged students.

Lack of Menstrual Hygiene management is a major problem for majority of the girls skipping schools during their periods and eventually dropping out at an early age and missing out on their education as we all are aware that most poor or illiterate girls don't know about pads during her period days.

Volunteers created an awareness about menstrual hygiene. It was a wonderful session delivered by a Gynecologist doctor. Our team distributed sanitary pads to approx. 75 woman of different age group at a slum area opposite C block market East of Kailash.



Quarter 2 (July 2022 – September 2022)

In the month of July, we enrolled more students at our center for primary education. We even started recreational activities for them like playing indoor games such as carom and other activities such as drawing etc. The students were taught different subject and we also motivate them to become a better human being in their life.

Teachers give them guidance and teach the students with innovative technique to develop their skills like speaking, listening and learning to communicate with other students. Everyone greatly enjoyed and learned with the help of these new and innovative teaching techniques. The teachers present were kind enough to correct their notebooks including work that was done before and pointed out the mistakes made previously by the students. Both students and teachers wholly enjoyed and learnt a lot.

In the month of August, we visited slum area and observe that the many students were not having the books to study. We distributed books and stationary items to the needy students of primary and middle classes students. We also distributed Olympiad books to students of various classes and we benefited to approximately 40 students in the books and stationary distribution drive.





Quarter 3 (October 2022 – December 2022)

In the festive and auspicious month of October a special lunch was organized for the divyang students. Organization gave them a session of interview skills to divyang students. We distributed various eatables and snacks to primary students who came for classes and learnt from the teacher. Our students learnt a lot and were even tested on their learnings later that day.

On the occasion of Diwali, primary school students were distributed a variety of snacks and sweets motivated them to improve their weakness, personal hygiene and work on their strength.

During Christmas we distributed eatables and stationary items to the primary students who are enrolled at the center. We taught them Vedic Math's and English conversation and also recite stories to them which they liked a lot and taught them the moral behind the story.



Quarter 4 (January 2023 – March 2023)

In the month of January student and professor of “Department of social work” from ALAGAPPA University, Tamil Nadu visited to our organization. Approximately 29 students and 2 Professor had come for a study tour in our organization.

Our organization President gave a speech about the organization activities and about the divyang students. We answered the queries of the social work students of ALAGAPPA University, Tamil Nadu. Memento was handed over to the Professor of ALAGAPPA University. Vote of thanks was expressed to the students and Professor of the university.

We organized a dinner for the divyang students and aware about their basic communication and interview skills.
